OVC's Original Vision for SVAAs

Provide comprehensive, academically-based, fundamental education and training for victim assistance service providers, victim advocates, criminal justice personnel, and allied professionals who routinely deal with crime victims.



OVC's Original Vision for SVAAs

- Establish an SVAA in every state to provide foundation-level education/training for victim assistance providers and allied professionals
- Encourage victim assistance course of study in colleges and universities nationwide
- Integrate victim studies into post-secondary curricula
- Create certificate and/or degree programs



Evolution of SVAAs

- 1995 National Victim Assistance Academy developed
- 1998 Co-sponsors state-level academy in Michigan
- 1999 Five pilots academies launched: Colorado,
 - Connecticut, Pennsylvania, Texas, Utah
- 2000-2013 45 state academies funded



Drivers of Change

- **2013** Vision 21 launches
- **2014** SVAA program assessment completed
- 2015 SVAA TTA project & VOCA discretionary training solicitations released
- **2015-Present** Significant increases in VOCA funding



SVAAs Today

- OVC no longer directly funds SVAAs; however, states have funding to support academies and related training through:
 - VOCA discretionary training \$
 - VOCA administrative \$
 - Other sources
- OVC funds SVAA Resource Center to provide dedicated training and technical assistance to SVAAs and related training efforts.




